41.6% of California's irrigated farmland has received deep cuts to this year's water supply

That's an area 10 times the size of Los Angeles

Almost 30% of irrigated farmland will get no surface water at all

Researchers at the University of California issued a report last year based on computer modeling that estimated that the Central Valley's surface water supply diminished by about one-third, or 6.6 million acre-feet with 410,000 acres assumed to be fallowed.

Approximately 620,000 acres are estimated to be out of production this year

41.6% of California's irrigated farmland has had its water supply cut by 80% or more

Job losses are expected to reach 23,000

Economic costs to California's economy exceeding \$5.7 billion
